

2022 Balingup Medieval Carnivale Conditions of Entry

Tickets issued by the Balingup Medieval Carnivale Committee are subject to the following conditions:

- *The State Government Covid Restrictions at the time of the Carnivale will apply.*
- *Opening hours are from 10:00 am to 8.00 pm on Saturday*
- *Free entry for children under 12 is subject to being accompanied by a paying Parent or guardian. Adults must not leave children unattended.*
- *BMC is a non-smoking event.*
- *Visitors are responsible for the security of their own property. Please don't leave bags unattended.*

Restricted and Prohibited Items- for the comfort and safety of visitors, staff and volunteers the following items are not permitted to be brought into the Carnivale:

- *Animals (except service animals, such as assistance dogs & police dogs)*
Alcohol (there is Wine/ Cider/ Mead tastings – any alcohol purchased is not to be opened onsite)
- *Musical instruments (unless prior consent), Amplifiers or Whistles.*
- *Drones (includes items also defined by the CASA rules).*
- *Unauthorised advertising material or flyers. (without BMC Committee approval).*
- *Weapons - The Balingup Medieval Carnivale refers to the Weapons Act 1999 – Western Australia for guidance on weapons at the event. Consultation with Police regarding the public weapons regulations confirm a Sword is a Schedule II weapon and is not able to be worn in public places or events. They have advised there are heavy fines for traveling with or carrying any schedule 2 weapons. The re-enactors and performers who are licensed for weapons are subject to many policies and are heavily controlled. Sellers of weapons are also restricted by law and regulations as well as our stallholder policies.*
- *Alcohol – the event is conducted in accordance with an appropriate Liquor Permit. Be advised that: Alcohol must not be taken into the BMC site at any time. Checking procedures may apply to prevent persons possessing liquor from entering. Intoxicated persons will not be permitted to enter.*

Images of the Balingup Medieval Carnivale:

- *Visitors consent to being photographed, filmed and recorded as visitors to the BMC and consent to the use of any such film, image or recording at the discretion of The Committee.*
- *Images taken cannot be used for any purpose other than private use. Images cannot be sold, licensed, published or otherwise commercially exploited.*
- *Making or distributing of broadcasts or news reports is not permitted without consent of The BMC Committee.*

Public Safety Warning:

- *Visitors may experience some aspects that are potentially hazardous including activities associated with close proximity of horses and other animals, uneven and potentially slippery gravelled or grassed surfaces and loud noises.*
- *The BMC Committee does not take responsibility for personal injury, loss or damage however caused, including any negligence (but not gross negligence), breach of duty, default or omission on the part of The Committee's staff, volunteers, contractors or agents.*
- *Appointed Committee and Volunteers reserve the right, with reasonable cause, to refuse entry to any person or remove any person from the BMC without any entitlement to a refund and in compliance with the Tort of Trespass, Council regulations and State and Commonwealth statutes.*

BMC is an "All Weather Event", except in such case of a Major Weather or Emergency or an act of violence would the Committee cancel the event. The BMC program is subject to change as necessary without notice due to weather conditions or other operational reasons.
